1) Roll Call

- a) Present were Board Members Greg Brudnicki, Joshua Street, Billy Rader, Jenna Haligas, and Scott Pilla. Chairman Nirav Banker and Board Member Kenneth Brown were absent
- 2) Approval of Minutes November 29, 2022
 - a) Motion to approve the Minutes of November 29, 2023 was made by Board Member Billy Rader and seconded by Board Member Scott Pilla. The motion passed unanimously.
- 3) Acceptance of TDT Revenue Reports FY23 Collections thru November 2022
 - a) Motion to accept the TDT Revenue Reports as presented was made by Board Member Scott Pilla and seconded by Board Member Joshua Street. The motion passed unanimously.
- 4) Financial Status Report Period Ending December 31, 2022
 - a) Board Member Street suggested with the upcoming capital projects on the horizon that Project accounts for committed funds should be implemented. Board Member Street motioned to accept the Financial Status Report as presented. Seconded by Board Member Rader the motion passed unanimously.
- 5) Ratification of hotelbeds.com
 - a) Board Member Scott Pilla commented about his successful experience with hotelbeds in Orlando and was happy to see the contract. Board Member Jenna Haligas then made the motion to ratify the contract. Seconded by Board Member Joshua Street the motion passed unanimously.
- 6) KOSA Mardi Gras Event Grant Application

a) CEO Vigil recommended the Board approve a reimbursable event grant award not to exceed \$20,000. Board Member Jenna Haligas motioned to approve followed by a second from Board Member Joshua Street. The motion passed unanimously.


7) CEO Update

- a) CEO Vigil told the Board that she and one other staff member would be participating in the 2023 VISIT FLORIDA Encounter Show – which is a business to business domestic trade show.
- b) CEO Vigil updated the Board on the sewer backup at the Visitor's Center and explained they should expect to see increased expenditures in the Repair and Maintenance line item. She also explained the timing of the sewer backup was actually a blessing because they realized the sewer cleanout valve needs to be relocated before the area is enclosed for temperature controlled storage.
- c) CEO Vigil stated the immersion trip with the new marketing agency, MWB, went really well and she was looking forward to working with the agency on upcoming campaigns.
- d) CEO Vigil stated website enhancements to include a new events module, places module with Google Business integration, Itineraries module, and Trip Planning module would be implemented within the next two weeks. She also stated staff had begun in-house work to have the Special Events Grant Application be available as an online form and as a downloadable form.
- e) CEO Vigil informed the Board that she was elected President of the regional ecotourism marketing group, Explore Northwest Florida, and DPC is working in conjunction with FSU-PC and Explore Northwest Florida to bring an ecotourism event to Panama City.
- f) CEO Vigil requested the Board allow her to move forward with the next phases of the St Andrews School project. She did state that it was difficult to navigate the funding sources with the City lease in place on the property and for them to consider (at the City level) to request a lease termination. Board Member Brudnicki stated ownership of the facility didn't matter that we needed to get the project

rolling and get the facility activated and he supported the termination of lease. The other board members in attendance agreed and provided CEO Vigil with direction to try to secure restoration and programming oversight of the project.




